- High performance levels in local competitions
- Capacity and willingness to develop

### National Youth Championships (Boys and Girls)

- 18 - 23 years of age
- High level of personal fitness
- Commitment to refereeing
- High performance levels in local competitions
- Capacity and willingness to develop
- Considered to be a potential elite referee

### Institute Challenge

- 18 - 25 years of age
- High level of personal fitness
- Commitment to refereeing
- High performance levels in local competitions
- Capacity and willingness to develop
- Designated as a potential elite referee
- Previous successful attendance at a national tournament

## Secondary Schools

- 18 - 25 years of age
- High level of personal fitness
- Commitment to refereeing
- High performance levels in local competitions
- Capacity and willingness to develop
- Designated as a potential elite referee
- Previous successful attendance at a national tournament
  - Selected as a match official for NYL or Women's League (where practicable)

FFA will select the participants for the Secondary Schools Tournament and may select the match officials for the Institute Challenge.

Whilst referees may pass through all of these designated stages, it is unlikely that an individual would be permitted to attend the same tournament more than once.

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
